Congratulations! Your son was elected by his peers as a candidate for the honorary camping society of the Boy Scouts of America, the Order of the Arrow (O-A). The O-A is a national brotherhood of honor Scouts that originated in 1915. The purposes of the O-A are: to recognize the those campers who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives; to develop and maintain camping traditions and spirit within Scouting units; to promote Scout camping; and, to crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others.

Candidates for the Order of the Arrow are chosen not only for what they have done, but also for what they are expected to do in serving the welfare of others. Because your son was selected for candidacy by the unique method of being elected by his peers, we are sure that he is well worthy of this honor.

Your son must now participate in an induction Ordeal weekend (conclave) within one year of the date of his election. Our Lodge has three induction conclave weekends per year: spring at D-A or Cole Canoe Base and fall at D-A. The induction conclaves offer a unique opportunity for him to reflect on his personal commitment to the principles of the Scout Oath and Law. The weekends will also allow him to become acquainted with the principles and purposes of the Order of the Arrow. The induction conclave must be completed by each new candidate and is a meaningful and inspiring experience that will not be soon forgotten.

Induction into the Order of the Arrow will open many new doors for your son. Our Lodge participates in many events every year such as the Lincoln Pilgrimage, O-A section conclaves, National Order of the Arrow Conference (NOAC), and various fellowship weekends. Dear Candidate for the Order of the Arrow:

Congratulations on your election! You are now eligible to take upon yourself the induction Ordeal (conclave) experience. The induction conclave must be completed within one year from the date of your election. The induction conclaves are:

September 19-21, 2008 @ D-A Scout Ranch, Metamora, MI
April 24-26, 2009 @ D-bar-A Scout Ranch, Metamora, MI
June 5-7, 2008 @ Cole Canoe Base, Alger, MI

The induction weekend starts with registration at Trout Lake Cabin between 7:00 and 8:00 pm on Friday night and concludes at 10:00 am on Sunday morning. At Cole, the start time is 7:30 pm – 9:00 pm.

For the induction, you will need:

- Complete Boy Scout Field Uniform
 - Sleeping Bag
 - Ground cloth / tarp
 - Rain gear / poncho
 - Toilet and shower articles
 - Change of clean clothes
- Work clothes (wear to camp):
- Heavy footwear (boots)
 - Work pants (jeans)
 - Work shirt (t-shirt, long sleeve)
 - Old jacket
 - Work gloves

THE JUNE AND SEPTEMBER EVENTS REQUIRE A TENT. PLEASE BRING ONE.

The cost for the induction weekend will be \$40.00 at D-A and only \$30.00 at Cole Canoe Base and includes an Order of the Arrow sash, O-A Handbook, Lodge flap, Lodge dues for one year, and food. A "Candidate Registration Form" (attached) with the payment should be received at Detroit Area Council NO LATER THAN THE MONDAY before the induction weekend. Order of the Arrow

For Scouting's Honor Campers

Purpose of the Order

- To recognize those campers – Scouts, Varsity – who best exemplify the Scout Oath and Law in their daily lives and by such recognition that causes other campers to conduct themselves in such a manner as to warrant recognition.
- To develop and maintain camping traditions and spirit.
- To promote Scout camping, which reaches its greatest effectiveness as a part of the unit's camping program, both year-round and in the summer camp, as directed by the camping committee of the council.
- To crystallize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life of purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others.

History

The Order of the Arrow was founded in the summer of 1915. It grew out of a desire to emphasize that the good Scout camper is not only proficient in the skills of Scoutcraft, but also practices the principles of the Scout Oath and Law. It was intended to make these Scout principles more effective in the lives of Scout campers. It focuses particular attention on making cheerfulness, service, and brotherhood realities to a boy. A unit chooses from their camping members, those who best exemplify these traits, to become a member of the Order of the Arrow.

What is the Order of the Arrow?

It is a society of Boy Scouts that functions as a part of the regular camping program of the Boy Scouts of America. Its foremost purpose is to promote and enrich Scout camping.

The Arrow members in a local Scout council form a Lodge (used as in Indian tradition in the sense of the hunting lodge of the council lodge).

Elements of Indian tradition are used in the Order of the Arrow ceremonies for the dramatic effect. However, the Indian aspects of the Order should never obscure its objectives.

One becomes a member not so much for what he has done, but for what he is expected to do.

Eligibility

To become a member, a young man (under the age of 21) must be a registered Scout in a unit, have experienced 15 days and nights of camping, which includes one long term camp (summer camp), have achieved the rank of First Class, and be approved by his Scoutmaster. For an adult to become a member, he/she must be nominated by the unit committee.
